- Clean or replace air conditioning filters
- Inspect, clean or replace kitchen vent hood filters

Quarterly

- Check your drainage conditions for no standing water and to make sure water isn't draining toward your foundation
- Check your GFCls (ground fault circuit interrupters) by tripping the circuit interrupter buttons and resetting
- Inspect, lubricate and clean all exterior vents. Make sure air flows freely and each has an operable damper to prevent back flow of outside air or small animals from entering your home




- Every 6 months, inspect and service heating/AC units
- Inspect and repair caulked areas in kitchen, bath, flushing wet access areas, windows, and doors
- Clean and repair gutters
- Check batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide alarms



- Inspect, adjust, and lubricate garage doors and lock systems

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS CHECKLIST

Emergencies, whether man-made or natural, often occur without warning. While officials are responding to the larger event they may not be able to respond to individual needs. You may be required to shelter in your current place or even leave familiar surroundings. The key to managing yourself in an emergency is to have a plan and prepare for the "what ifs". Your family will cope best by preparing for disaster before it strikes. Once disaster hits, you will not have time to shop or search for supplies. If you gather supplies in advance, your family can endure an evacuation or home confinement. One way to prepare for emergencies is to create an emergency kit that will enable you to survive for at least ten days on your own. You should prepare two kits, one for sheltering in place and another that you can take with you in case you need to leave your home.

★ He's all Hat and no Cattle ★

This is probably pretty obvious, but it is someone that likes to put on a good front or appearance but really has no credentials, real world skills or any knowledge on whatever he is spouting off about. In other areas this individual is the know it all, blowhard or the poser.

★ Toad Choker ★

This is also referred to as a frog strangler or a turd floater, and means a heavy torrential downpour. Since most of Texas is pretty flat, heavy rains pose a true flash flooding hazard as well as lots of issues with closed roads.

★Y'all ★

y'all, which is often pronounced yaaaaaallllllllll, is a way of referring to at least one other person. In general if you are talking to more than a handful of people the correct southern and Texas address would be "all y'all". This is sometimes a bit confusing but just go with the flow.

★ Do Wut? ★

This is the standard response if you weren't paying attention or didn't hear what the speaker said for some reason. In other cultures the way this is often expressed is "excuse me" or "pardon me" or even "could you please repeat that?" Sometimes this phrase is expanded to "Do wut now?"

★ Greeze and Earl ★

Despite what you might think, these are actually components to your car. Greeze, otherwise known as grease, and earl or oil, often cause stains on your hands or clothes. These stains are considered to be greezy, and are really problematic in hot weather. Of course you also have to constantly keep checking the pressure in your tiyures (tires) because the hot temperatures cause problems there as well.

★ Uh huh ★

When you say "thank you" often you were hear the response "uh huh". This should be interpreted in this situation as your welcome. It can also be a sign of agreement with the last statement made.

★ Bowed Up ★

When someone is really angry and is taking on an aggressive body stance, they are said to be all bowed up. Kids that are talking back to their parents will often be told not to get all bowed up or they will get a "whipping".

★ Jaw Jackin ★

Just talking to hear yourself or talking smack to someone. Jaw jacking is often combined with getting bowed up.

* Hitched but not Churched *

This is a way of saying that a couple is living together without being married. In the Bible belt this is still a taboo, and there are many sayings that relate to heathens, sin and immoral behavior.

★ Broke Bad ★

Basically this refers to anyone that seems to come from a good family but he or she has gone over to the dark side. It can refer to horses that are incorrectly "broke" or trained, resulting in mean and unfriendly animals but in Texas it typically refers to people.

★ They are Proud of That ★

Being proud of something means that you place an unusually or unreasonably high value on some item that is really not worth near that amount. This is a subjective statement but it is commonly heard at auctions, swap meets, garage sales and farmer's markets.

★ Chunk ★

Ok, this one is really weird. If you are throwing something a short distance they say they are chunking it. Don't know why Texans don't say chucking it like the rest of the world but there ya go!

★ Neighbor ★

Neighbors are the people in your community, someone you talked to once at the Dairy Queen that lives up (or down) the road, someone you are distantly related to through marriage or someone that lives in the same county as you do. It really doesn't have anything with physical address locations and can be really misleading.

★ Coke ★

Anything that is called soda or pop anywhere else is called Coke in Texas. For example, Coke can be Pepsi, Sprite, Dr. Pepper or almost anything else that fizzes and comes in a can or bottle.

★ Tea ★

Tea is always iced tea and is always sweet iced tea unless you specifically ask for unsweetened. If you have never had southern sweet tea you may want to try a small taste before ordering a whole glass. Let's just say it is sort of like drinking icing!

★ Not plum but pert near ★

This is a highly descriptive and phonetic way to say everything isn't exactly perfect but it is close enough to be

workable. If someone asks you how you are doing you can always answer "fair to midlin", which is the equivalent of not plum but pert near!

★ Fix'in ★

This is the ultimate in Texan speak. Fix'in, which is not said fixing but is sometimes pronounced as "fiddin", is a way to indicate that at some yet to be determined time some action is going to be taken. An example of this would be "I'm fix'in to go to the store". Notice this doesn't indicate when and can be also used to indicate you are thinking about possibility doing something sometime.

TEXAS TO-DO'S

- 1. Learn the language. The plural of "you" is not "you guys" or simply "you." It's "y'all." You're not getting ready to cook a meal. You're fixin' to rustle up some grub.
- 2. Drive a truck. Texans don't drive puny little cars. Something like a Dodge Ram 3500 is adequate, but any heavy duty pickup will do.
- 3. Learn to cook one of the Big Three. Preferably, learn all three of them, but one will do for a start. The Big Three are barbecued brisket, chili con carne, and chicken fried steak.
- 4. Own something with a Texas flag on it. If you can't find or don't want anything with the flag already on it, put a Texas flag sticker on it.
- 5. Own at least one set of duds. That means, at the bare minimum, a cowboy hat, cowboy boots, and jeans. If you want to be really hardcore, get you some cowboy cut Wrangler jeans, a Western style shirt, and a belt with a big buckle with either a longhorn steer head or a Texas lone star on it.
- 6. Listen to Texan music. That doesn't mean just country music. If you don't like outlaw country, there are other alternatives like Texas blues.
- 7. Be proud. Know that Texas is a great state to share culture with You may be perceived by foreigners as conceited or arrogant, but your fellow Texans will always support you as long as you embrace your Texan culture. Everything is bigger and better in Texas, hands down.

Brown Recluse Spiders

This small sized spiders are actually shy and try to stay away from people as much as possible but when they do bite they cause massive horrible looking wounds that take months to heal. The worse part is people that are sensitive to the venom will actually develop necrosis of the tissue that will lead to deep lesions of 10 inches or more. The poison can also spread to internal organs and lead to eventual death. While this is rare, who wants to take the chance?

Venomous Snakes

Although there are only 4 (make a note they stress ONLY 4) types of venomous snakes native to Texas there are actually 15 subspecies that could potentially be lethal. There are snakes all over Texas. People find them in their gardens, their kid's sandboxes and of course the ever popular snake in the toilet complaint. Since many of the venomous snakes look similar to the less harmful snakes it is generally recommended you just stay clear of anything that slithers.

Bats

Bats are something you just can't plan for. They swoop in as you are sitting on the deck having a coffee or just enjoying the millions of frogs, crickets and other weird sounding bugs that strike up a chorus as the sun goes down. There are 32 different species of bats found in the state at any given time. Austin, the capital city of Texas, actually promotes the Congress Avenue bridge as a huge tourist attraction as the bats leave from under the bridge every night in the summer. There are millions of the little things that fly out from the bridge to circle the city. Bats on their own are creepy, but bats in your hair are even worse – trust me!

Oh Wait There Are More

Of course Texas is also home to almost every other type of stinging, biting or menacing insect known to man. Fire ants, very aptly named as they seem to set your skin on fire with their bite, are all over the state. They make sitting on the grass a very dicey decision unless you are into that sort of thing

Finally, last but not least, are chiggers. I am not making this up, cross my heart. Chiggers are also known as Harvest mites and they chew a tiny hole in your skin, which will soon erupt into an itchy, puss-filled lesion that will drive you crazy.

You have 30 days from the time you move here to register your vehicle in the state. To learn how, read our Apply to be Texan booklet. In no time at all, we will be proud to call you a Registered Texan!

Here's the steps to becoming a Registered Texan:

1. Have your vehicle inspected.

Simply take your vehicle to a certified Texas Department of Public Safety inspection station. (Many mechanic shops, oil change locations and service stations are certified by DPS as inspection stations.) Bring your insurance card.

In Texas, you must show you have insurance coverage for a minimum of \$30,000 per injured person, up to a total of \$60,000 for everyone injured in an accident, and \$25,000 for property damage.

2. Get your vehicle registration sticker and license plates.

To do this, you must visit your local county tax-assessor collector office. You will need that insurance card, the inspection papers, and proof you own the vehicle, such as the registration or title from your previous state. You can also show a current foreign/military ownership document or foreign evidence of ownership.

You need to fill out and bring a form to the county tax office. You are not required to title your vehicle in Texas, but first-time registrants must fill out and complete Form 130-U. If you do not possess the title because it has a lien, you also must complete Form VTR-272.

While at the county tax assessor-collector's office be sure to ask your customer service representative to sign you up for eReminder. We'll email you when it's time to renew, and in most counties you can renew your registration online.

Note: Active duty members of the U.S. Armed Forces and non-resident, full-time students attending a Texas college or university are not required to register or title their vehicles in Texas


